



I have always created artwork with the idea of leaving it behind, in essence as a souvenir. This exhibition explores that idea, along with referencing specific places both familiar and foreign.

Reflecting on my experience studying in Europe, my childhood connections to the East Coast and my current home here in the Midwest, I create work that seeks to address the universal through intimate self-expression. This is realized through imagery that includes, maps, shells, birds and constellations, while investigating dualities such as the past and the present and the heavenly and the earthly. I employ the technique of collage in order to spark the imagination, along with more historical mediums like oil and encaustic painting. This media lends itself to a process that is both additive and subtractive in nature, at times revealing and at other times concealing. I rarely work with a clear outcome in mind; rather I work in an intuitive fashion, making discoveries as I go, embracing the unknown.

# **New Hybrids: Environmental Anomalies**

*Recent Drawings by Jon Swindler*

My artistic practice is tied to a rural upbringing for which I have simultaneous feelings of reverence and revulsion. Ordinary objects, which are inexorably linked to this upbringing, inspire the images. Though banal, these objects evoke a personal, visceral response in which I am inclined to act and re-act upon through drawing. Invented forms and vessels based on these structures function as private metaphors for concerns of consumption and the environment, serving as icons of my personal history.

This recent body of work is the result of a desire to marry disparate imagery; divergent layers of botanical illustrations, inadvertent drippings and industrial protrusions are fused within the page. These peculiar vocabularies secure themselves within the economic process of drawing and erasing, ultimately retaining the visual and physical history of their development, producing a virtual palimpsest. All of which provides information to be lost or found, deemed relevant or irrelevant by the viewer, revealing the cyclical nature of my artistic practice.











