

To those of you new to the Manifest membership, welcome. And to our old friends, thanks so much for continuing to be there for Manifest and for sharing our history.



So you're on board for another excellent year at Manifest, and we are ever grateful.








#### ARTISTS AND WORKS SUBMITTED TO THE INDA

Manifest's fifth major drawing publication, the INDA 5, is juried and ready for design once again by Kristin Cullen. For the INDA 5 Manifest received nearly 1300 submissions from 502 artists in 44 states and 26 countries

The publication will include 114 works by 72 artists from 23 states and 10 countries including Australia, Canada, Croatia, England, France, Germany, Japan, Portugal, Scotland, and the United States.

The book will be available in soft and hardcover later this year.
